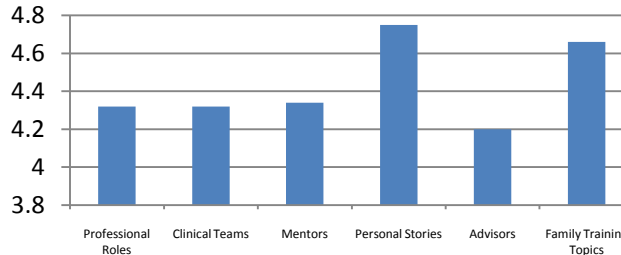
Background:

The LEND Family Discipline Network wanted to learn about the multiple roles that families play in educating all LEND trainees and the impact of this family involvement.

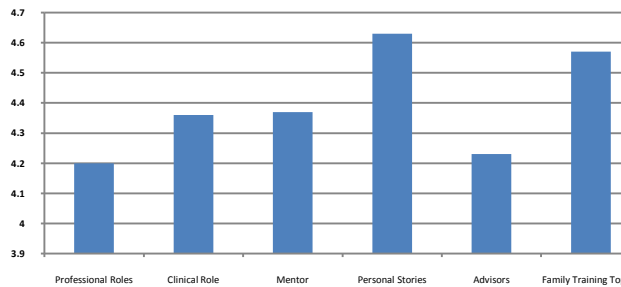
- In 2012 - We developed a pilot. Nine LENDs participated in the survey pilot.
- In 2013-
 - The LEND Family Network, in conjunction with the CA-LEND program (an input from the Training Directors Committee), analyzed the pilot survey results and developed the 2013 on-line survey.

All LEND Directors were sent an announcement of the survey and an instructions-to-participant sheet to send to graduating LEND fellows. 187 fellows from 24 LENDs participated in the survey.

How important to you were...

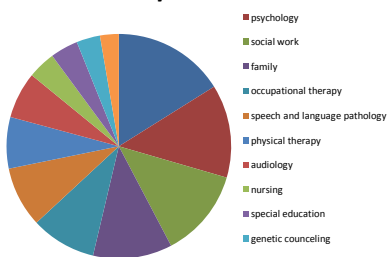


What is the likely impact of...

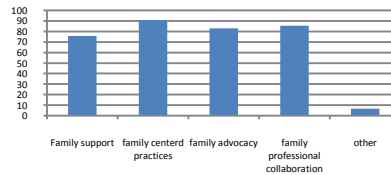

Discussion and Next Steps

Four issues arose which require further exploration and/or revision to the survey:

•Due to delays in the IRB process, the survey was not sent to LEND directors until the end of April. This was too late for some centers to participate in the survey. Therefore we are treating 2013 as a pilot.

For 2014, the survey will be sent in March.

•While we know how many trainees opened the survey and responded to each survey question, we do not know how many trainees received the survey.

For 2014, survey, we will ask each LEND to provide us with the number of fellows who were asked to participate in the survey.

•It was our intent to make their survey results available participating LENDs. However, a concern has developed that programs with fewer participants may be able to identify the responses of individuals.

For 2014, we will share general responses, but not demographic information for individual respondents.

•14 participants did not identify which LEND site they attended. Therefore, we do not have an accurate record of how many programs participated.

For 2014, the LEND site will be a required field, with an assurance that site demographics will not be shared.
