**A. Personal Statement**

As Clinical Director of the Mental Health Center at Children’s Hospital Los Angeles, I am responsible for the clinical services delivered by an interprofessional group of 120 faculty, staff and accredited interns, residents and fellows. I am responsible for developing clinical program, supported by governmental contracts, foundation grants, and have also led, or co-led efforts to obtain 5 HRSA-supported training grants in psychology since 2003. Most relevant to the Secret Agent Society project, I have led efforts to implement 7 Evidence-Based Practices in Psychology at CHLA. The Secret Agent Society Project seeks research-funding support for a replication study of an evidence-based social skills intervention targeting youth with ASD. I have developed a team of four post-doctoral fellows who have been instrumental in developing this project, and these fellows and I have completed in training with the SAS developer and are certified to deliver the practice. I have also expanded the research team to include the Medical Director of CHLA’s Autism Treatment Network, and psychologists from UCLA who have co-trained with our fellows in the intervention and have contributed to the project design. I will oversee the clinical services component of the project and will participate in data analysis and the preparation of manuscripts resulting from this collaborative study.
